As Pastor John W. Minnema, senior pastor of the Hawthorne Gospel Church, began his address to the HCA Class of 2025, he stood at a podium that was used in the Hawthorne Gospel Mission Tent nearly 100 years ago! He explained to the class that they have the distinct honor of graduating during HGC's Centennial Celebration! This was a poignant moment for me as I saw, on full display, God's faithfulness to the HGC and HCA family. This ceremony brought to mind afresh the lives being impacted with the gospel 100 years after that first meeting in a firehall in June of 1925!

As a part of HCA's sixth grade Bible curriculum, our students memorize Hebrews 11, often referred to as the "Hall of Faith." In it, we read of God's faithful people who put their faith in action, holding unswervingly to the Lord's promise of their heavenly city! And so it is, that with grateful hearts, we look back on all those who put their faith in action at HGC and HCA over the decades.

Among these faithful servants are people you may know. Pastor Herrmann Braunlin was HGC's first pastor, who led the church for six decades! Pastor John Minnema succeeded Pastor Braunlin and has led HGC and its ministries since 1986.

Jack Wyrtzen moved on from HGC's Evening Bible School to start the Word of Life Bible Conference and Word of Life Camp (where, through the great generosity of a family, HCA sends our incoming freshman each year). George Sweeting attended HGC before becoming a pastor and eventually president of Moody Bible Institute. And, of course, Jack Raudenbush, one of HCA's beloved leaders.

There are many more whose names have been forgotten in this world, but whose faithfulness is celebrated by their Father in Heaven. There are scores of faithful servants who cooked meals, cleaned buildings, taught Sunday School, gave sacrificially, and mentored those who are now mentors themselves. This is how God works, He equips unworthy, incapable people who are open to His prompting and faithful in His service!

In my closing remarks to the Class of 2025, I challenged them, as I now challenge you. Let us recognize that none of the blessings we enjoy at HCA or HGC are built on our own shoulders, but on those who put their faith in action before us. Now, trusting the Lord, it is our calling to take up the cause, build on their foundation, trust in God's faithfulness, and impact the world for Christ!

Upper School Impacts the World for Christ!

Impacting the world for Christ is an essential part of Hawthorne Christian Academy's mission, and this year our middle and high school students embraced that calling with passion and purpose. Through prayerful planning and generous giving, students raised over \$5,900 to bless others in need and demonstrate the love of Christ in action.

One of the causes supported was ACSI's (Association of Christian Schools International) Crisis Response Fund. With a \$4,386 donation, HCA students helped provide support for Christian schools in Georgia and North Carolina that were affected by Hurricane Helene. These funds offered encouragement and tangible relief to communities still recovering from the storm's impact.

In addition, our students raised \$1,600 for Destiny Rescue,

a Christian ministry committed to rescuing children from the horrors of human trafficking. Destiny Rescue meets the immediate needs of these children and works to restore their hope and future through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

These fundraising efforts reflect more than just numbers. They reveal the heart of the HCA community - a heart that desires to serve, give, and make a lasting impact.

Through these initiatives, our students lived out their faith and showed what it means to be the hands and feet of Christ in a hurting world. We are so thankful for their continued commitment to making a difference for Christ.


